VITAMIN E AND ALZHEIMER'S PREVENTION

As the tragic disease, affecting more than <u>5 million elderly</u> <u>Americans</u>, grows in number research has not yet produced a cure. There has been one recent discovery in prevention.

BREAKTHROUGH RESEARCH

On January 1, 2014, the <u>Journal of the American Medical</u>
<u>Association</u> published a study linking a daily Vitamin E
supplement of 2000 IU to a slower cognitive decline of early
Alzheimer's disease.

THE STUDY'S DETAILS

There were 613 participants with mild to moderate Alzheimer's. Nearly all participants were men. All participants were already taking cholinesterase inhibitor, an Alzheimer's prescription drug. Over the course of two years, all participants suffered cognitive and functional declines overall. But the decline of functional ability was less dramatic for those who took Vitamin E.

A GRAIN OF SALT

This was a complex and intricate study. But the results should not be taken as the end-all. Contrarily, a previous study showed a higher incidence of death for individuals taking more than 400 IU of Vitamin E. The recent research is merely a step in the right direction.
